

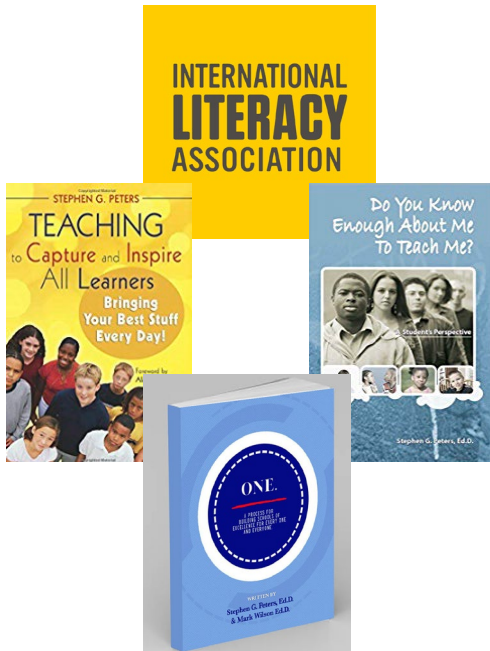


Dr. Stephen Peters,

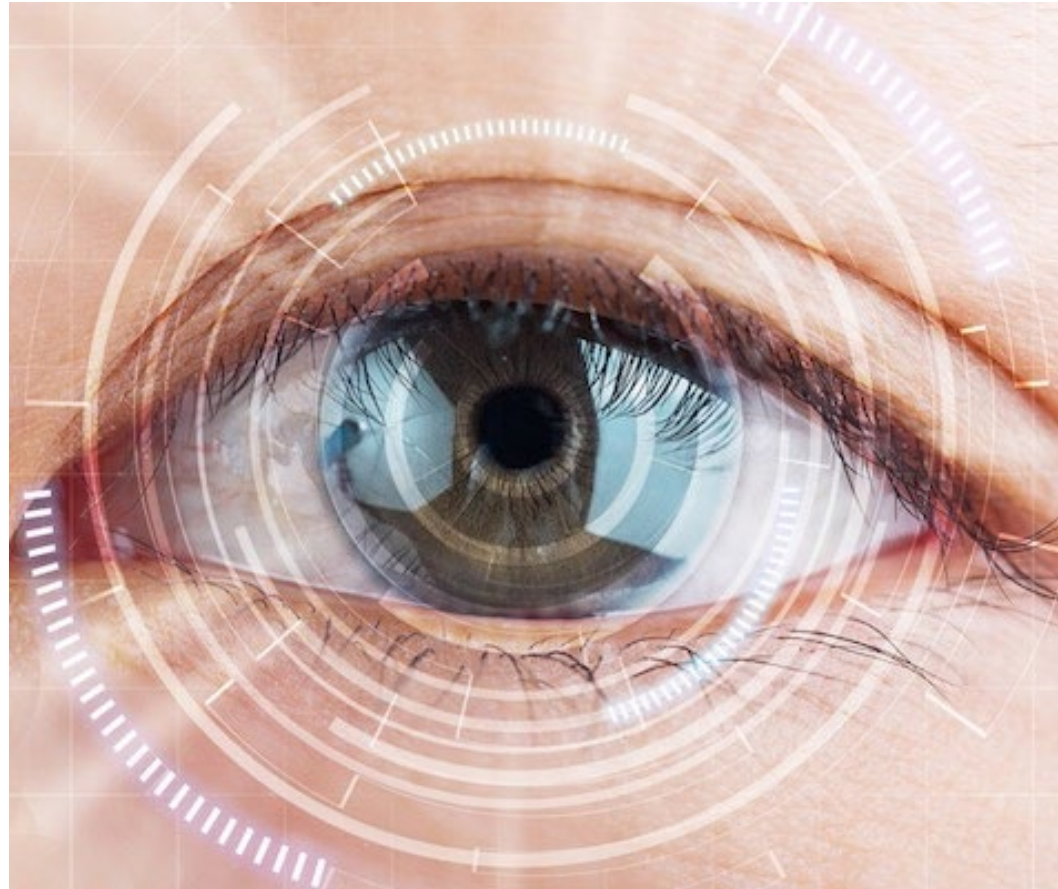
Mary Ellen Elia,

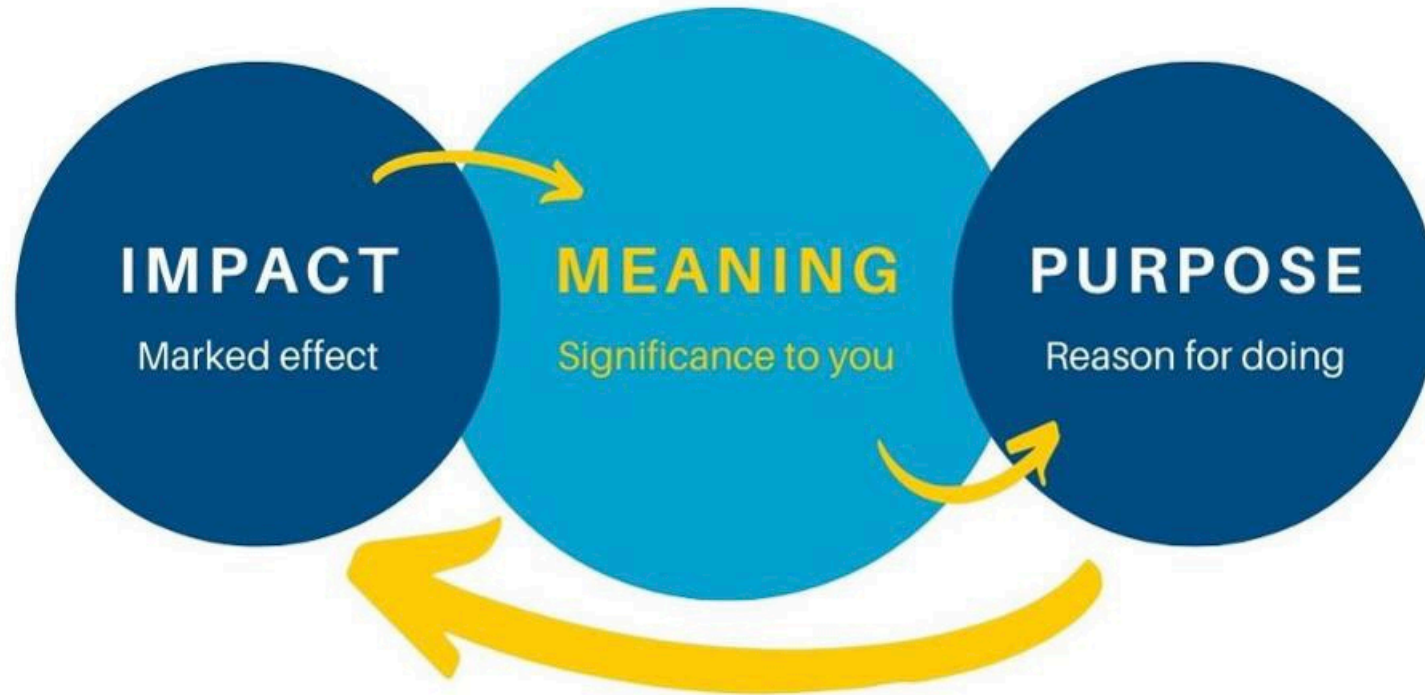
